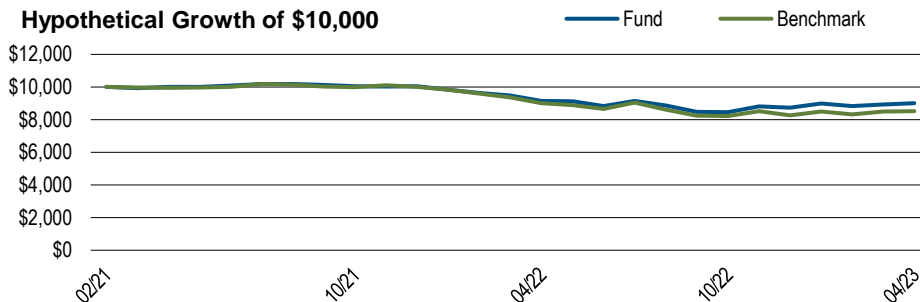

PIMCO Climate Bond Fund seeks optimal risk adjusted returns, consistent with prudent investment management, while giving consideration to long term climate-related risks and opportunities by primarily investing its assets in a diversified portfolio of Fixed Income Instruments of varying maturities.

- **Ability and access to drive solutions.** The fund seeks to deliver optimal risk-adjusted returns while supporting positive climate change solutions. The fund aims to do this by accessing a diversified portfolio of multi-sector global bonds from issuers of labeled and unlabeled green bonds*, as well as issuers demonstrating climate change leadership.
- **Positioned for positive change.** PIMCO is well-positioned to help influence and support positive climate change solutions. The firm's expansive reach in fixed income markets due to its size, scope of expertise and ability to engage issuers has made it an impactful participant, which we believe has helped guide issuers and encourage market movement toward meaningful climate change solutions.

*Green bonds are bonds with use-of-proceeds devoted to environmental projects.

Unlabeled green bonds are issuers, determined by PIMCO, to be fundamentally aligned to climate solutions.

The Bloomberg MSCI Global Green Bond Index (CAD Hedged) offers investors an objective and robust measure of the global market for fixed income securities issued to fund projects with direct environmental benefits. An independent research driven methodology is used to evaluate index-eligible green bonds to ensure they adhere to established Green Bond Principles and to classify bonds by their environmental use of proceeds.
